THE FLOWERS THIS MORNING

The flowers in the sanctuary are given to the glory of God by Leslie and Lloyd Prince and in celebration of Athul Isaac Allen, who was sweetly added to their family last week.

MUSIC THIS MORNING

Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) composed one of the best known Requiem settings of the twentieth century. Duruflé set each of the nine movements to ancient melodies - Gregorian chant – used for centuries to set the mass texts. The juxtaposition of lyrical melodies with texts that

speak of the sorrow and pain of life brings both pain and comfort into focus. The final movement, *In Paradisum*, gives great comfort as the soul wings its way into the next realm. Originally scored for orchestra, Duruflé reduced the orchestration to a fiendishly difficult organ score. We welcome Dr. Boyd Jones, professor of organ studies at Stetson University (FL) as our guest organist today. He is a concert organ and harpsichord recitalist, and is featured on a widely acclaimed recording of the Duruflé Requiem sung by the Stetson University Choir.
