In keeping with the Presbyterian tenet of the priesthood of all believers, Morningside members participate regularly in worship leadership. This Sunday's lay reader is Katrina Weis.

SERVICE MUSIC

Maurice Duruflé, 1902-1986, was one of France's leading musicians in the 20th century. He wrote organ and choral music as well as instrumental music. His style of writing is tonal with ideas of impressionism. The modality in his music shows his love of Gregorian chant. The "Meditation" was written in 1964 and Duruflé and his wife, Marie-Madeleine, played the "Meditation" often for the church in Paris where they were organists, Sainte-Etienne-du-Mont. François Couperin, 1668-1733, was the "Master of the French Baroque." The offertory and the postlude are from his Mass for the Convents. This music is referred to as French Classical, because of the short length of the pieces. Each piece had a particular use in the Mass. Couperin, like Duruflé, was a dedicated church musician.
