SERVICE MUSIC

In the Lutheran tradition, *Allein Gott in der Höh sei Ehr*, is sung as the Gloria in service. The Gloria praises God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son, and the Holy Spirit acknowledging the Trinity. This ornamented chorale by Bach, BWV 662, is from the *Great Eighteen Chorales* that Bach composed while at Leipzig. Today, the chorale will be played with light flutes for the accompaniment and a cornet, composed of several stops, for the solo voice.

Johann Sebastian Bach's *Fugue in E-flat Major*, often referred to as the "St. Anne" fugue, is the final piece from his *Clavierübung*. This is a collection of liturgical organ works that Bach had published during his lifetime. The "St. Anne" title refers to the opening fugue subject, which references the hymn tune *St. Anne* (1708), or otherwise known as "Our God, Our Help in Ages Past." This renowned work consisting of three fugues and its key signature of three flats, suggests Bach's emphasis on the Trinity. The third and final fugue closes with the "St. Anne" subject returning in the pedal.


YOGA
