WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY

Welcome to worship at Morningside Presbyterian Church. SERVICE MUSIC

Praeludium in e-moll - Nicolas Bruhns (1665-1697) was a prized pupil of Dietrich Buxtehude. From his short lifetime, only five extant organ works remain. The *Praeludium in e moll* is composed in the *Stylus phantasticus* style, which is the freest and least dependent type of composition. This "fantastic style" demonstrates the performers' ability to interpret the work through the pushing and pulling of tempi, conveying stronger and weaker harmonies. The *Praeludium's* structure alternates between *Toccata* and *Fugue* sections allowing for registration changes and shift in *affekt* or mood.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

There will be a brief congregational meeting following worship today. Second, the congregation will vote on new bylaws, as required by the new Form of Government enacted by the Presbyterian General Assembly in 2012. Child care will continue. VOLUNTEERING FOR CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS

We continue to give thanks for all the incredible support we received for Vacation Bible School, and for the folks that have already started signing up for Mission Camp. As you can see, the summer is not a slow time for children's programming at MPC - especially with Sunday School Kick Off being the second Sunday in August. If anyone has 2-4 hours any day during the summer, there is quite a bit of random projects needing attention at this time - reorganizing class supplies, sorting and packing VBS props, stocking new closets in pre-school age Sunday School room, preparing new music notebooks for our elementary age Children's Worship. DRIVERS/CHAPERONES NEEDED FOR MISSION CAMP

There are 17 kids registered for elementary age Mission Camp and 17 more for Youth Track Mission Camp July 21-25. That totals 34 attendees that we must transport to off-site outreach projects Monday-Wednesday. Check your calendars NOW and let Melinda know if there is a day (or half day) that you can drive/chaperone to help us make this hands-on experience a reality for the children and youth of our church. *We must secure volunteers in June* so that we have time to review our Child Protection Policy before the actual camp - any off-site volunteers are considered lead volunteers, which includes reading of CPP, one hour training video on-line, and background check including driving record.
