WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY

SERVICE MUSIC

Dance II and III - American composer Calvin Hampton was the organist at Calvary Episcopal Church in Manhattan and became famous for offering free Friday midnight recitals. *Five Dances for Organ* was commissioned by the Holtkamp Organ Company and later dedicated to Walter Holtkamp and Karen McFarlane, who were married around the premiere of this work. In Hampton's music one can hear the influence of Stravinsky or Prokofiev through Hampton's use of rhythmic cells and mixed meter. *Dance II*, entitled "At the Ballet," is in an unusual meter of 10/8 and illustrates a dancer on *pointe*. *Dance III*, entitled, "Those Americans," uses a constant rhythmic cell with a jazzy triplet influence throughout. Calvin Hampton's music is heard both in recital and throughout liturgies of the church. Hampton's influence served to preserve traditional worship in the United States.

This Saturday, July 12, seven youth, who are rising eighth graders, will travel to Government Street Presbyterian Church in Mobile, Alabama. They have signed up for a week of mission and service on the bay through July 18. Please keep them in your prayers.

DRIVERS/CHAPERONES NEEDED FOR MISSION CAMP

There are 17 kids registered for elementary age Mission Camp and 17 more for Youth Track Mission Camp July 21-25. That totals 34 attendees that we must transport to off-site outreach projects Monday-Wednesday. Check your calendars NOW and let Melinda know if there is a day (or half day) that you can drive/chaperone to help us make this hands-on experience a reality for the children and youth of our church. **We must secure volunteers now** so that we have time to review our Child Protection Policy before the actual camp - any off-site volunteers are considered lead volunteers, which includes reading of CPP, one hour training video on-line, and background check including driving record. (*Specific needs: Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday - 5 more drivers for each day; Monday - 1 more afternoon driver; Wednesday - 1 more morning driver.*)
