However, some of these writings have become quite popular in recent years, and they reveal the astounding diversity of interpretations of the lives of Jesus and Paul. Our study will focus on three of the most interesting and prominent works that do not appear in the New Testament: The Gospel of Thomas, The Gospel of Judas, and the Acts of Paul.
