WELCOME to Summer Camp 2007!

Exploring. Learning and Summer Fun! Our camps are designed to keep bodies busy and minds moving while providing a safe, loving environment where little ones feel free to explore, learn and most importantly...*play*! All of our camps will provide the structure and security children enjoyed during the school year, but with **loads** of awesome summer fun thrown in!

About Our Camps

They will run in Two-week themed sessions to include water play, special guests, enrichment classes, special celebrations, and family days for all age groups. To further enhance their experience, there will be local group outings for 3's and 4's groups.

Summer Day Stay n' Play camp

Age group: rising 2's (your child will be 2 by 9/1/2007)

Summer Discovery Camp

Age group: rising 3's (your child will be 3 by 9/1/2007)

Days: Monday thru Friday

Times: 9:30-1:30*

Summer Adventure Camp

Age group: rising 4's and 5's – this is a combined age class
(your child will be 4 by 9/1/2007 **or** entering Kindergarten Fall/2007)

Days: Monday-Friday

Special Guests:

Dim the lights and start the show! At least once per two-week session MPP will host a special outside guest. Whether it's musicians, dancers, storytellers, jugglers, or a petting zoo it's sure to be a treat!

Individual classes will also be inviting community guests pertinent to the current camp theme. Policeman, animal rescuers, exotic pet specialists (and their pet spiders of course!), or members of a local outdoor adventure group are all sure to add to the adventure of learning

Special Events:

Campers can look forward to at least one *extra* special day per camp theme. Depending on the camp theme and age group there'll be special celebrations like 'bug bash', 'campfire cookout', a splash day luau, or special events like a classroom art show, musical performance, or family picnic at the park.

Campers will cool off with wet and wild outdoor fun! Sprinkler and garden hose play, water and sand sensory tables, exploring the science of water, outdoor painting and more! (2 year olds)

This camp is geared specifically toward younger campers. These twos will play, explore, celebrate, create and welcome special guests just like the big guy all while they are getting the security of routine and nurturing care that our littler ones need.

There will be a few extras tossed in, just for the two's! Classroom storytellers, pizza parties, movies and popcorn, or extra special in-house guests to make their experience fun and educational!

Session 1 (June 4th – June 15th)

Riddles, rhymes and story times:
