From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Friends,

Thank you for your hospitality to me this year. As I set finger-tips to keys I am approaching my first anniversary as your pastor. As I think back over the past year, I want to tell you how grateful I am for the way that you have welcomed me.

You have welcomed me by being kind to me, by asking about my dog, by inviting me to lunch and dinner as well as by respecting my need for personal space. You have opened your lives to me. I am deeply humbled by your welcome and grateful to God for you.

Hospitality is such a key component to Christian faith. I was talking about it with Theology on Tap the other night, and we had a great conversation. The roots of our call to hospitality go deep. Our common history with the Jewish faith means that the Old Testament culture of hospitality is our faith story. In the time of the Old Testament, there was a practice that if your enemy showed up on your doorstep, it was your obligation to provide care for them for the duration of their time within your home. If your enemy's enemies showed up, you were morally bound to defend them, even if their enemies were your friends. The reason was you never knew when you might need hospitality.

It is interesting what the Greek roots of the word hospitality imply. The word that we translate as hospitality is a composite of two root words: *philos* and *xenos*: love and outsider. We are to love the outsider if we are practicing the biblical mandate to hospitality.

Morningside is a congregation whose identity is built around hospitality. Every Sunday I stand up and say we mean our word of welcome as plainly as I can say it. I mean it. I say it on your behalf because it has been made so clear to me by you that you mean it. It is one of the many things that make me proud to be your pastor.


Keep up the good work, keep on extending God's word of welcome. Always ask, "Who isn't here and how can we welcome them?" It makes God very happy.

Morningside Receives ‘Children in Mission’ Grant

Since kids can’t build at a Habitat house (until they are 16), or sort at food pantries (until they are 8) or stay overnight at the women’s shelter, we are always searching for age-appropriate opportunities for them to be active in helping others. MPC recently received a \$4,450 grant from the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta – specifically from PATH (Presbyterian Answer to Hunger) to do more mission with the children of our community.

We have learned from many an outreach project that when kids do make sandwiches, assemble health and hy-

giene kits or shop for food to deliver to food pantries, the time spent is short because our funds don’t cover a great many items. Program Director Melinda Sandkam says, “We are excited to be in receipt of this grant and look forward to providing many more outreach activities for our kids this year. All of these projects need adult support – whether to buy supplies, run a project or provide transportation.” Please let Melinda know that you would be interested in helping us show our kids how to respond to God’s message to serve those in need.

Fellowship Meets Stewardship at Congregational Lunch

Members are invited. Visitors are invited. Everyone is welcome to come enjoy our congregational lunches after worship quarterly. So imagine trying to decide whether all 400-odd members and their friends will show up or just a few dozen. We’ve never run out of food, but we’ve had a gracious plenty left over most of the time.

buy far more food than we need. In other words—as you’ve probably gathered by now—we’re going to re-emphasize the RSVP process. It’s easy—call or email the church office, or use our new RSVP card. Be assured that on Sunday, Feb. 5, if any visitors decide to join us for lunch, they are welcome and even if you didn’t RSVP—you are welcome to come to Fellowship Hall and join us once everyone is served. Suggested donation is \$10, adult; \$5, children.


