From the Director

Ahhh! A fresh start – yea for a new year! I do not often make New Year's resolutions, but I do want to share with you some things that I have learned over the years that are important. The old adage, "never go to bed angry" is true, but so is "never say good-bye angry". Trust is easily broken and so hard to repair. Act now; ask permission later is a recipe for disaster. A kind word can work miracles. Hugs are the BEST! These are just a few good things to live by, and not only for the first few weeks of the year!

In the wake of the horrible news we got on December 14, I received quite a few questions about our emergency policy/procedures here at MPP and I want to make you aware of those. First of all, as you know, there is always a staff member at the door during arrival and dismissal. If we do not recognize someone, we ask for ID. We require you to send a note or call if pick up plans change. Our doors. including the door leading to the preschool wing from the church offices, are locked during preschool hours. We conduct fire and tornado drills. We do background checks on subs as well as all staff. Two adults are required to be with the children. The teachers and I have an Emergency Plan manual that details what to do in all sorts of emergencies including such things as a missing child, poisoning, abduction and intruder situations. We all hate to think that any of these might happen, but if we are not prepared for the worst then we are not living up to our promise to care for your children. You can help us all out by adhering to note sending and other safety-related policies and introducing us to new nannies and relatives who might be picking up.

Bottom line is, we care deeply about your children. If you ever have any questions or concerns at all, please let me know.



Spotlight on Three Year Olds

Morningside Presbyterian Preschool classes follow guidelines that form the foundation of our child-centered teaching philosophy. These goals and objectives help provide developmental building blocks that will help the children progress successfully while at the same time allowing for flexibility and attention to the individual needs of each child. It is important to note that every child is unique and acquires these skills in his or her own time.

This month we are sharing our guidelines for Three Year Olds.



Goals and Objectives for Three Year Olds

Independence in:

- bathroom habits and grooming
- peer interaction
- resolving conflict, teacher may intervene as necessary, but children are encouraged to work things out for themselves as much as possible
- eating skills
- dressing putting on and taking off coats, shoes and socks
- navigating stairs
- opening and closing objects such as book bags, lunch boxes, etc.
- entering classroom with ease

Continued growth in:

- respect for teachers and peers
- sitting quietly for longer periods
- listening to more detailed books
- memorizing songs and fingerplays
- creative and imaginative play, increased cooperative play with one another and in small groups – games and puzzles and free play
- science and exploration, facilitated with our Science teacher, but also during nature walks, a science center in the room with magnets, magnifying glasses and so on
- following directions
- developing and strengthening fine motor skills, cutting, tearing, playdough, smaller manipulatives
- using words instead of hands
- Spanish

- improving speech and manners
- learning to be patient and wait
- communication skills and ability to express an idea/feeling to peers

Introduction to:

- letter recognition and sounds, bringing show and tell items that begin with letter of the week, making short word lists, reading books that highlight letter of the week
- writing name, often accomplished through tracing
- number recognition and counting, looking at pictures and reading books that talk about numbers, counting all the time
- cutting with scissors
- gluing neatly
- fine motor development using table manipulatives and puzzles
- color identification, with more emphasis on mastery
- shape identification, with more emphasis on mastery
- literature awareness and creating stories, through dictating stories that go with artwork and introduction to well-known authors, such as Dr. Seuss and Eric Carle
- how to handle and read books
