Today's Anthem ("How Lovely Is Thy Dwelling Place") is the 4th movement from Johannes Brahms' choral/orchestral masterwork "A German Requiem" of 1865-68. It is a sacred but non-liturgical work, meaning that it is not a setting of the Latin Requiem Mass. Brahms chose words from the Bible (set in German), consistently centering on the consoling of the bereaved. Today's selection offers text from Psalm 84 (sung frequently in English.) Lowell Mason, composer of today's "Festival Doxology", was born in Massachusetts, then spent some of his early adulthood in Savannah, GA. Mason took on the task of producing a Hymnal where tunes would be drawn from the work of European composers. It was soon published by the Boston Handel and Haydn Society, for which he served as President. In the mid -1850s, he served as Music Director for Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church, New York.

EASTER BANNERS

The Easter banners made of batik fabrics represent the life and light of Christ rising from death to eternal life on Easter morning. These two banners were made identically to bring emphasis and thanks to Christ Jesus and the Holy Power of God on Easter
