We thought you might be interested in knowing how grateful this organization is for our help. Typically, when gentlemen arrive at Journey, they are unemployed and without many of the basic necessities to live a healthy life. Within 45 days, Journey finds 70% of their clients are back at work, either part time or full time, returning to a normal schedule and routine, and earning references.

Our monthly chapel donations help these men restore hope, provide some measure of dignity in a difficult time, and send the message the community has not forgotten about them. Camp Morningside


